Paul's First Missionary Journey

ACTS 13-14

- From Antioch to Seleucia
 - Paul, Barnabas, and John Mark
 - Set sail from Seleucia to Salamis in Cyprus
 - Then went through the island of Cyprus to the city Paphos
 - Here met Bar-jesus a false prophet
 - But the deputy of the city named Sergius Paulus wanted to know about Jesus
 - Paul was anger at Bar-jesus and he became blind
-

ACTS 13-14

- From Paphos to Perga in Pamphylia
 - John Mark left back to Jerusalem. Paul and Barnabas continued
 - Antioch in Pisidia
 - Taught in the synagogue and many were saved (Acts 13: 47-49)
 - They were removed from the city by the Jews and persecution started (Acts 13:45, 50)
 - Went to Iconium
 - Also taught they and had many converts, but Jews caused trouble and wanted to kill Paul and Barnabas by stoning (Acts 14:5)

ACTS 13-14

- They fled to Lystra
 - Healed a cripple man (Acts 14:8-10)
 - The people thought Paul and Barnabas were gods, Barnabas Jupiter and Paul Mercurius (Acts 14:12)
 - They went to correct the people and they became angry and Paul was stoned almost to death (Acts 14:19)
 - The next day they fled to Derbe
 - They taught many there
 - Returned on the same way back (Acts 14:22-23)
 - Derbe -> Lystra -> Iconium -> Antioch, Pisidia -> Perga, Pamphylia -> Attalia, Pamphylia -> Antioch

Paul's Second Missionary Journey

ACTS 15:36-18:22

- Started at Antioch went to Syria and Cilicia
 - Paul and Silas
 - Barnabas and John Mark set sail to Cyprus
 - They split because Paul did not want to journey with John Mark again because he had left them previously
 - Then to Derbe and Lystra
 - Met Timothy, who was a young boy
 - Father was Greek and mother a Jew (Acts 16:3)
 - Grandmother Lois and mother Eunice (2 Timothy 1:5)

ACTS 15:36-18:22

- Went throughout Phrygia and Galatia and Asia
 - Then Mysia to Troas
 - Then Macedonia
 - Had a dream to go to Macedonia(Acts 16:9)
 - Philippi which is the capital of Macedonia (Acts 16:12)
 - Met Lydia a newly converted Christian (Acts 16:14)
 - There was a demon possessed girl in the city. Paul cast out the demon and the owners of the girl were angry that they were not able to make money off of her possession and had Paul and Silas arrested (Acts 16: 16-24)
-

ACTS 15:36-18:22

- Paul and Silas were whipped and placed into prison in Philippi
 - While they were in prison they were praying and singing songs so that all the other prisoners could hear
 - There was a great earthquake and their chains were loosed. The guard thought everyone would have left and was ready to kill himself but Paul had him stop and shared the Gospel so that the guard and all his household was saved. (Acts 16:25-34)
-

ACTS 15:36-18:22

- They were released the next day because they had done no wrong and because Paul was a Roman citizen
 - They went back to Lydia's house
 - They went to Amphipolis and Apollonia and came to Thessalonica. The Jews were angry at Paul for teaching the Gospel.
 - They fled to Berea
 - The people were noble searching the scripture daily (Acts 17:11)
 - Paul to Athens, leaving behind Silas and Timothy

ACTS 15:36-18:22

- Spoke the Gospel to the Greeks at Athens at Mar's Hill
 - Acts 17:24-28
 - From Athens to Corinth
 - Aquila and Priscilla who had a church in their house and were tent makers like Paul (Acts 18:2-3, 1 Corinthians 16:19)
 - From Corinth to Ephesus (Acts 18:19)
 - Lastly, sailed from Ephesus to Caesarea and went to Antioch (Acts 18:22)

 - Went to Macedonia
 - Then to Achaia
 - Philippi to Troas
 - Eutychus falling from the window (Acts 20:7-12)
 - Represents being in the world and in the Lord
 - We cannot have both need to concentrate upon the Lord

ACTS 18:23- 21:16

- From Troas to Miletus
 - Paul's testimony
 - Acts 20:19-21;24;32;35
 - Serve the Lord with humility
 - Testify to everyone about repentance and faith in Lord Jesus
 - Neither count I my life dear, finish the course with joy
 - Word of God is to build us up
 - Support the weak in laboring
 - Better to give than to receive

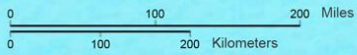

 - Paul tells of his conversion to the mob of people ready to kill him
 - Acts 22:1-21
 - The chief captain realizes Paul is a Roman citizen
 - Acts 22:24-29
 - Paul before the Sanhedrin
 - Paul before the Pharisees
 - Acts 23:10-11
-

ACTS 21:17- 26:32

- A plot to kill Paul was made
 - Paul tells the chief captain
 - The captain secretly and safely takes Paul to the governor Felix
 - Acts 23:23-24
 - Felix keeps Paul bound for two years
 - The governor changes from Felix to Festus
 - Festus asks what Paul has done and wants to send him to Jerusalem to have favor with the Jews

ACTS 21:17- 26:32

- Paul says that he did nothing wrong of the Jews and wants to appeal before Caesar
 - Acts 25:10-12
 - King Agrippa comes to greet Festus and hears about Paul and wants to hear his case
 - Paul shares testimony to King Agrippa (Acts 26)
 - Acts 26:19
 - King Agrippa realizes Paul has done nothing wrong, wants to set him free but Paul had asked to appeal to Caesar so he must go to Rome

 - Acts 27:3
 - There was bad weather and Paul warned the captain of the ship that it would not be safe to sail, but he did not listen to Paul
 - Acts 27:9-11
 - There was a big storm that caused much chaos for the people upon the ship
 - Acts 27:14-20

ACTS 27:1- 28:31

- Paul shares his faith to the people on the ship as they were disheartened and hungry
 - Acts 27:21-25
 - Paul breaks bread and gives thanks to the Lord
 - There were 276 people on the ship
 - Acts 27:37
 - As the Lord told Paul they all escaped safely to land
 - Acts 27:33-44
 - They all came to the island of Melita
-

ACTS 27:1- 28:31

- At the island of Melita, the native people showed them much kindness
 - While Paul was collecting sticks for the fire a viper bit him and it was venomous and the native people were scared, but nothing happened to Paul so they thought he was a god
 - Acts 28:1-6
 - The chief of the island was named Publius and his father was sick, so they sent for Paul
 - Acts 28:7-10
-

ACTS 27:1- 28:31

- After three months they departed and landed in Syracuse
 - Then they continued to Rome
 - At Rome Paul was allowed to live under house arrest
 - Acts 28:16
 - Paul yet again preached to the Jews in Rome
 - They came to his place where he was to hear him
 - Acts 28:23
 - Paul dwelt two years under house arrest, preaching the kingdom of God to all who came to him

Facts about Paul

- 2 Corinthians 11: 22-33
 - **22** Are they Hebrews? So *am* I. Are they Israelites? So *am* I. Are they the seed of Abraham? So *am* I. **23** Are they ministers of Christ?—I speak as a fool—I *am* more: in labors more abundant, in stripes above measure, in prisons more frequently, in deaths often. **24** From the Jews five times I received forty *stripes* minus one. **25** Three times I was beaten with rods; once I was stoned; three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I have been in the deep; **26** *in* journeys often, *in* perils of waters, *in* perils of robbers, *in* perils of *my own* countrymen, *in* perils of the Gentiles, *in* perils in the city, *in* perils in the wilderness, *in* perils in the sea, *in* perils among false brethren; **27** in weariness and toil, in sleeplessness often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness— **28** besides the other things, what comes upon me daily: my deep concern for all the churches.

- 2 Corinthians 11: 22-33
 - **29** Who is weak, and I am not weak? Who is made to stumble, and I do not burn *with indignation*? **30** If I must boast, I will boast in the things which concern my infirmity. **31** The God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is blessed forever, knows that I am not lying. **32** In Damascus the governor, under Aretas the king, was guarding the city of the Damascenes with a garrison, desiring to arrest me; **33** but I was let down in a basket through a window in the wall, and escaped from his hands.
